

## **Resolution on Pakistan**

Adopted by the Transparency International Annual Membership Meeting  
Bali, Indonesia, 28 October 2007

At its Annual Membership Meeting on 27 to 28 October 2007 in Bali, Indonesia, the TI Movement voiced deep dismay at recent developments in Pakistan that confer immunity on the perpetrators of major corruption through an ordinance promulgated by the Government of Pakistan. TI expressed its deep disappointment that this action was taken only a few days after Pakistan ratified the United Nations Convention against Corruption (UNCAC), and despite all the efforts made to recover assets stolen from the people of Pakistan. The grant of immunity constitutes a violation of the provisions of UNCAC. It will only encourage the corrupt to commit future crimes in a climate of impunity. This goes against the interest of the people of Pakistan and its future progress. This is also a most damaging precedent which undermines efforts under UNCAC to strengthen asset recovery action, in Pakistan and all over the world.

TI expresses its solidarity with its National Chapter and the people of Pakistan in their efforts to reverse this deplorable decision.
