What do the new generation in Asia Pacific think about corruption? We asked young people in four countries for their views. Here are the results.

## OUR YOUTH INTEGRITY SURVEY:

We surveyed around 4,000 young people  
From Fiji, Indonesia, South Korea, Sri Lanka  
Between 15-30 years of age.






We asked young people if they had encountered corruption in the last 12 months, and in what situation. Here are the most frequent answers by country.\*

# YOUTH IN CRISIS


Would you cheat to get ahead? Most of the young people surveyed said honesty was more important than wealth. But how many would live up to their ideals?

## IDEALS VS. REALITY: COULD YOU RESIST CORRUPTION?


When they were presented with real-life scenarios,\* almost three-quarters of young people admitted they would use corruption to gain an advantage.
